


From the Archives

The narrative of The Chamber unfolds in 1904, when Albany's forward-thinkers gathered to enrich the fabric of our city with prosperity.





ODOT work on Ellsworth Bridge:



ODOT has contracted with Wildish Construction to raise the bridge supports on the Ellsworth St bridge. When complete, the bridge will offer greater clearance for freight trucks to cross without damaging the support beams. Construction is scheduled to start April 1st at 8:00 PM. The closure will be in effect nightly from 8:00PM to 6:00AM, Sunday night through Friday morning.

During the overnight closures, traffic will be detoured on to the Lyon St bridge with one lane in each direction. Flaggers will direct traffic at 1st and Lyon, returning eastbound traffic down 1st Ave back onto Ellsworth St. Parking will be impacted temporarily on 1st Ave between Lyon St and Ellsworth St and along Lyon St from 3rd Ave to 1st Ave.

If a Trespass Letter of Consent would be helpful to you, see the attached form in this newsletter and return it to the Albany Police Department. The original copy will be retained by the Albany Police Department.

In addition to your consent letter, your property must be posted with 'No Trespassing' signs.
